



Eva showing super concentration and resourcefulness in gathering all the ingredients and equipment to make and ice a chocolate cake. Looks delicious Fva!!

Great work Iris!








Year 4 children PSHE work for Children's Mental Health week

They where asked to think about what makes them unique and special. They made positivity jars and filled them with affirmations about themselves, here is some of their work.




Mollie's positivity jar and worksheet on what makes her unique.

How lovely Harry, the cakes look delicious!




Resilience
