



Science

In Science this term we will be looking at 'Animals including humans'. We will cover variation, sorting animals into different categories to understand how they are similar and how they are different. We will also learn about off-spring, this includes learning about what makes them grow up to become a healthy adult.

'Living things and their habitats' is our following unit. We will find out what it means to be 'living' and what a habitat is and where they are found.

Outdoor: Games—we will be focusing on developing throwing and catching skills.

Theme

The theme during Autumn term is 'The Great Fire of London.' We will be looking at the causes of the fire and the role Samuel Pepys played in recording happenings in a diary and shaping our knowledge of the event. We will also be looking at The Great Fire of Gateshead and Newcastle

Maths

In numeracy we will be learning about number and place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, fractions, measures, geometry and statistics.

We will be looking at reasoning and different problem solving activities.

We will be recording maths in many different ways and will be using lots of practical equipment.

Religious Education

We will be learning about 'Christianity, finding about why the bible is special and Christmas.

PSHE

We will learning about 'Relationships', this involves our relationships with family and friends, having safe relationships and how to respect ourselves and others
