Does your family enjoy reading? Then join our Facebook group, to share ideas, tips and recommendations.

'Lark the Shark' by Nathalie Newman and Henry Newman (Age 7)

Lark the Shark is a tale written by Natalie Newman and her son Henry Newman (7 at the time of writing), about a friendly shark who sets out to challenge people's perceptions of him.

When the children in class are taught about scary, dangerous sharks, Lark the shark overhears and is sad; he decides to prove he is friendly and helpful. This aspect of the story gives parents and teachers the ideal opportunity to open dialogue about stereotyping, how it can affect us to be on the receiving end of that, and how we can effectively challenge and overcome stereotyping. It also can be used to talk about emotions, and how we deal with them.


Lark demonstrates that he is indeed a friendly shark, with many lovely qualities, and proves to be really helpful by collecting all the litter in the oceans - litter created by humans! Such a lovely yet powerful tale, beautifully told through the words, rhymes and colourful illustrations.



Natalie, who has always had a passion for literature - a passion shared by Henry too loves sharks. She had a conversation with Henry about how unfair it was that sharks have such a bad reputation, 'After all,' she told us 'all they are doing is being at home in their ocean.' Henry's school homework topic at that time was environmental pollution - vet pollution of our oceans and seas wasn't part of that topic. When Henry learned more about the pollution of our oceans he was shocked, and asked 'Mummy, what can we

do to help?' It didn't take long for them to combine it all together, and come up with the idea of Lark - the friendly shark who helps clean up the sea.

Aimed at readers from 2 - 8 years old, Lark the Shark has won lots of praise for highlighting the issues of pollution to younger readers, and has been shared by The Marine Conservation Society on their UK Ocean Schools Resource Hub.

Reindeer Pancakes



Sieve together the flour & salt

Gradually whist in the egg then the milk. Leave to stand for 10 minutes.

Heat 1 tsp of oil in a 20cm frying pan, pouring off any excess oil.

Pour a thin layer of batter into the pan and fry for about 1 minute until golden brown.

Flip and cook the other side until golden brown and place on a plate.

Repeat with the rest of the batter.

Serve with your favourite topping



Get on your Bike!

Don't let the cooler weather stop you doing the things you love, like a good cycle ride. There's lots of family trails locally that won't get you and the kids too dirty. Some local parks have tarmacked areas that are ideal for enjoying a bike ride in any weather.

Gather together natural materials such as hollow bamboo canes, pine cones, barks, twigs and moss, and useful bits and bobs like old tiles for the roof, terracotta pots, and wooden pallets or bricks for the base. As well as helping creepy crawlies, larger ones might also be used by hedgehogs.

Delicious Gingerbread Cinnamon Cupcakes by Baking Mad

Ingredients you'll need

150g Unsalted butter (softened)

150g Billington's Unrefined Light Muscovado Sugar,

150g Self-raising white flour

1 tsp Ground ginger, 1/2 tsp Ground cinnamon

1 pinch Nutmeg (grated)

3 Free range large egg(s)

1 tbsp Milk (whole)

For the Buttercream

200g Unsalted butter (softened)

50g Billington's Unrefined Light Muscovado Sugar,

3 tbsp Milk (whole)

200g Silver Spoon Icing Sugar

1 pinch Ground cinnamon



How to make these delicious Gingerbread Cinnamon Cupcakes

Step 1: Preheat the oven to 180°C (fan 160°C, gas mark 4). Put 12 paper cupcake cases into a muffin tin.

Step 2: Cream together the butter and sugar. Sift the flour together with the spices. Gradually mix the eggs into the creamed butter and sugar, alternating with the flour. Finally, stir through the milk.

Step 3: Dollop the mixture in the cupcake cases and bake for 15–20 minutes until golden. Remove from the oven and leave to cool.

Step 4: For the buttercream melt 50g of the butter in a pan with the muscovado sugar. Add 2 tablespoons of the milk and stir to form a thick toffee sauce.

Step 5: Beat the remaining butter until smooth. Then sift in the icing sugar and add the toffee sauce (save 2-3 tablespoons for later) stirring thoroughly.

Step 6: Finally, pipe the buttercream on to the cupcakes, drizzle with the remaining toffee sauce and sprinkle with ground cinnamon.

About the bake

Whilst these cupcakes use Christmas flavours, we think they are lovely all year round. They go very nicely with cup of coffee too. Give them a go!
