Primary PE funding

The Government has allocated funding again this year to support primary schools to further develop three key areas of PE. The funding which we receive is ring fenced and can only be spent on the development of PE and sport in school

The three Key Areas are

- Improving the quality of Physical Education throughout the school
- Improving the opportunities for completion and school sport, including the development of extra-curricular activities
- Developing active and healthy lifestyles

At Wallsend Jubilee Primary School the PE coordinator and the Senior Leadership team have met and developed an action plan for PE. This action plan will outline our main objectives for PE and Sport for the academic year 2017-18. This plan has been carefully developed to ensure the development of the three key areas above and ensure good value for money.
