
English Task - 24.4.20

Try to include the following rules when recording the dialogue (speech):

Speech marks around the spoken words	
Punctuation mark before the closing speech mark eg. "Come on, you can do it!"	
New speaker - new line	
(whenever the speaker changes - start a new line)	
Better words for 'said' eg. Shouted	
(*Think about how the character will be feeling*)	
Use of adverbs eg. Nervously	
Reporting clause sometimes begins the sentence	
(eg. David replied nervously, "The water looks really	
high, I'm not sure about this?"

New speaker, new line

Punctuation mark before speech marks close
