



Science: This term we will cover:: Lights— We will explore how different objects are more or less visible in different levels of lighting., as well as investigating how objects with different surfaces (e.g. shiny vs matt) are more or less visible. Then we will look at how shadows vary as the distance between a light source and an object or surface is changed. Key Vocabulary: source, transparent, translucent, opaque, shiny, matt and reflection. Plants— We will make close observations of seeds and bulbs., classify seeds and bulbs then research and plan when and how to plant a range of seeds and bulbs. Later we will look after the plants as they grow—weeding, thinning, watering etc.

As they grow we will make close observations and measurements of their plants growing from seeds and bulbs.. **Key Vocabulary:** photosynthesis, pollination, dispersal, formation

In maths we will continue to consolidate our learning on the elements of fractions before moving onto decimals using a range of practical and written methods. Later on this term we will be focusing upon the properties of shape, space and measures, whilst improving our skills used to develop the mastery of Maths.

Games(Indoor) We will be taking part in a variety of indoor games/ fitness activities. Children will be developing key throwing, catching and balancing skills and techniques. As well as communicating with others in pairs and groups.

Computing

This term we will be investigating what is inside a computer, how a computer works, its memory, data and binary code. We will also analyse original games, build a simple version of them, and creatively extend the project.

French

This term we will be learning how to name a range of sports, discuss our likes and dislikes of them and whether we find them easy or hard, as well as describing body parts in French. We will also be learning about Bastille day on 14th July.

Theme

Our geography unit during the Spring term is 'The United Kingdom'- including our local area- Wallsend. We will be exploring the difference between the British isles, Great Britain and the UK. During the unit we will be using field work to observe, measure and record human and physical features in the local area. As we progress through we will describe and compare similarities and differences between areas as well as learning about different land uses; in particular historical changes and events.

Key vocabulary: Country, Region, Europe, Land Use, Economic activity, rural, urban, British, Isles Great Britain, Natural resources, settlement.

English

This term we will be covering a variety of elements of narrative which will be focusing on imaginative story writing. We will be working on inventing our own creative stories based upon familiar story structures. We will be reading 'Friend or Foe' by Michael Morpurgo as an extended text in class. During the term we will also be learning about 'non chronological reports linked to our Geography unit and practise writing formal and informal letters.

Grammar: This term we will continue to consistently use a range of punctuation, extending sentences through use of suitable connectives and making sure we include nouns and pronouns to avoid repetition in writing. We will be learning more about brackets and dashes and how they can be used to include extra detail.
