A synonym is a word or phrase that means the same (or very nearly the same) as another word or phrase. Words that are synonyms are described as synonymous.

<u>Task 1:</u> use the adjectives you have thought of and have a look in a thesaurus or just type: 'synonym for your adjective' online to find some other words that are similar.

For example: Rocks could be described as tall.

When I looked in my thesaurus (a book that gives you alternative words), I found some more alternative words (synonyms) that I could use to describe the rocks.

The rocks could also be described as: towering, soaring, giant, colossal

Remember to make sure the new words make sense.

For example, the thesaurus also said another word for tall is lanky. Lanky cannot be used to describe the rocks because lanky is only used to describe someone or some creature that is very thin and has long legs!
