Red words

When helping your child read 'red words' it is important to discuss that they do not look as they sound- *you can't Fred a red* (You can't sound it out).

For example: reading 'said' \rightarrow sounds like 'sed' but the 'e' sound is actually spelt 'ai'

It is important to discuss the parts of the word that look different to how it sounds so they remember how to spell it. You could ask your child to write the red word and circle the parts in it that look different to how it sounds.



Here are some red words that you could practice with your child
