Squirrel monkeys live in large groups in the tropical forests of South America. They eat fruit, insects, seeds, leaves, nuts and eggs. Infants can climb from birth.</p>	<p>Gorillas live in groups in the tropical forests of Africa. They eat leaves and fruit and sometimes travel huge distances looking for food every day. Infants ride on their mother's back for the first four months of their life. When gorillas grow up, they leave the group to form or join other families.</p>	<p>Elephants are the world's largest land mammals. They live in Africa and Asia. Elephants have got trunks which they use to eat grass, leaves and branches of trees. Elephants also use their trunks to drink, play, swim and stay cool. Baby elephants depend on adults to teach them how to survive.</p>

Pigs are intelligent and social animals. They are also clean. Pigs eat plants and meat. Newborn piglets can have as many as 8-12 brothers and sisters!</p>	<p>Grizzly bears live in North America. They eat plants, meat and fish. Female grizzly bears give birth to tiny cubs in winter. The cubs stay with their mother for 2 years learning how to survive. They grow up to be fierce hunters which can run at 48 kilometres an hour and eat 40 kilos of food a day.</p>

They are rodents from South America. Newborn pups have got teeth, claws and fur. They can eat solid food immediately. In some countries guinea pigs are popular pets. They eat grass, hay, raw fruit and vegetables.</p>
