




# Key Stage 2 The Queen's Fool by Ally Sherrick





The Summer Reading Challenge encourages children aged 4 to 11years to set themselves a reading challenge to help prevent the summer reading 'dip'. Each year the Challenge, presented by The Reading Agency and delivered by libraries, motivates children to keep reading, building their skills and confidence so they return to schools keen and ready to learn.

## **Summer Reading Challenge 2021**

This year's theme is Wild World Heroes and has been developed in partnership with WWF UK, the world's leading independent conservation organisation. It is a celebration of reading, nature and action for the environment. Children have to be a library member to take part, but participation is completely free. As they read, they collect special stickers and rewards along the way. Children who complete the challenge receive a medal and certificate. Wild World Heroes is brought to life with bespoke artwork from top children's illustrator, Heath McKenzie and will inspire children to stand up for the future of our planet.



## Wild World Heroes - Launches Saturday 10th July

This year, the Challenge will be available both online and in all North Tyneside libraries. Children can read whatever they like from North Tyneside's fantastic range of children's books, including eBooks and eAudiobooks from our Borrowbox service.
