

PSHE - Rules and Responsibilities

LO: To know why it is important to follow rules; to consider what might happen if rules and laws are broken (consequences).

Fair rules have been carefully thought about and designed to keep us all safe and happy. When rules are not followed, there can sometimes be a consequence (an unpleasant result or punishment).

Not learning spellings and times tables.	
Running whilst holding the ball in a football game.
