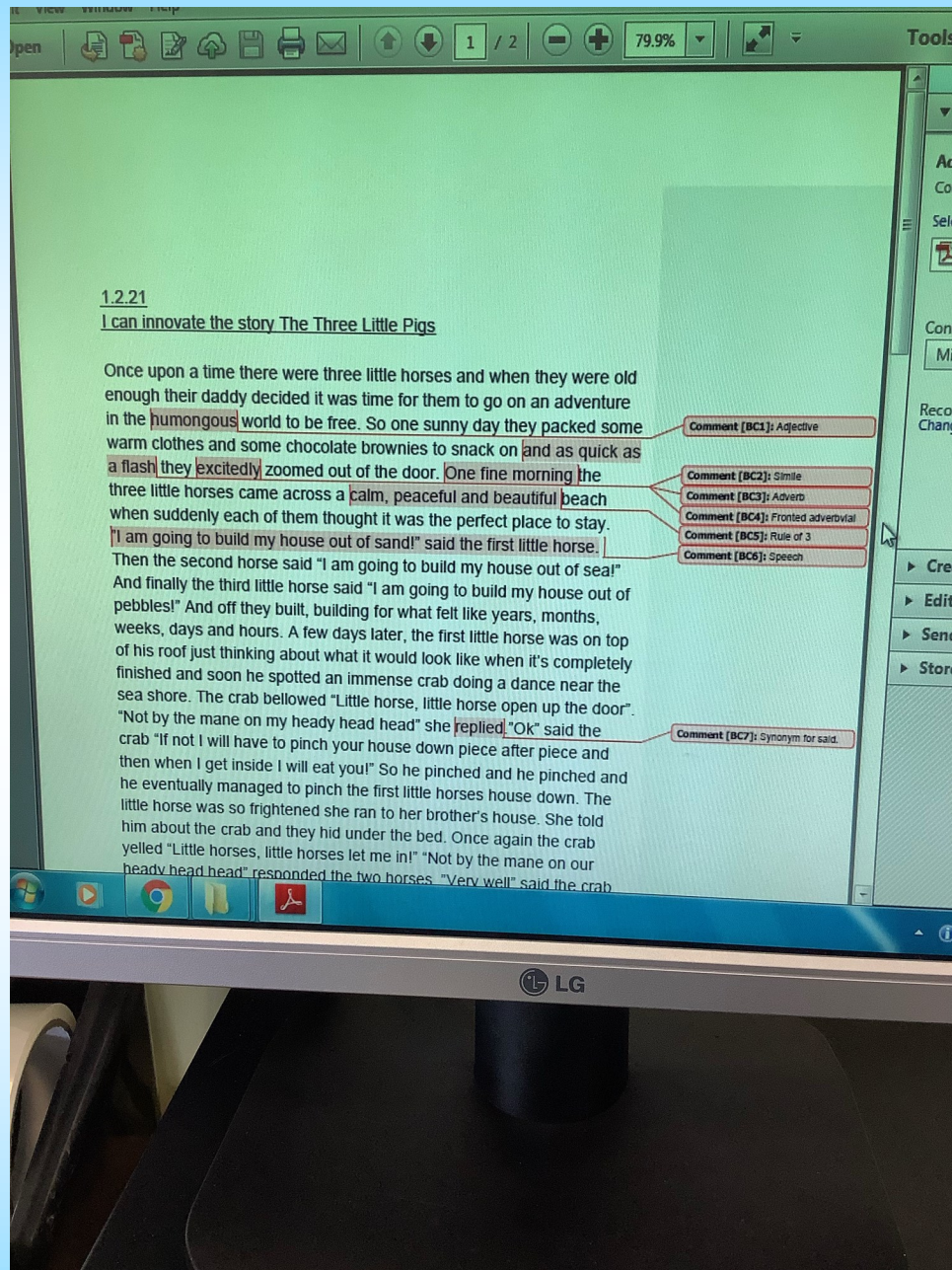

Well done Danny I'm sure with Eddie is a good help!

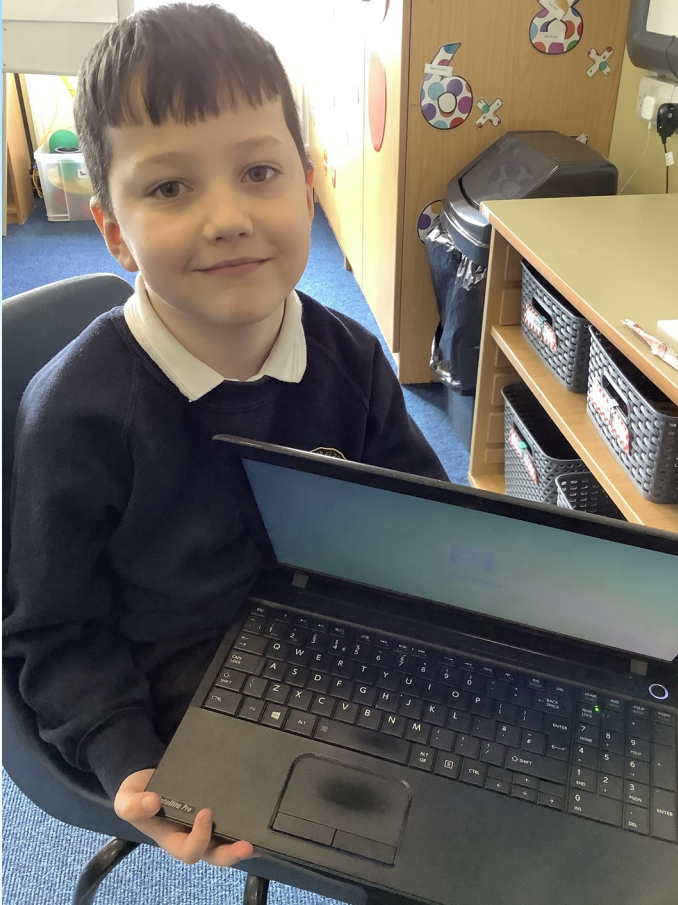


Responsibility
