

Clearwater School in Kenya

Wallsend Jubilee Primary (via the grandparents of two of our pupils) sent some gifts over to Clearwater School in Kenya for the children to enjoy. These included exercise books, pencils, rubbers and sharpeners. The sorts of things we use every day in school, are a real treat to the children in Mombassa.

This was their response to us:

“Jambo (“hello” in Swahili) – from Clearwater School, Mugili, Kwale, Mombassa, Kenya.”

“Santi Sana (“thank you”) for all the lovely gifts to our school – all the children use the gifts. We hope you like the gifts we sent to you. – They are hand carved by our people.”



Schooling in Clearwater costs about £30 per term and all family members are expected to help with paying these fees.



Sidi, aged 5 is the best artist in the school and she wanted to draw a flower for you all and say “Karibo” which means “welcome” in Swahili.



Kenya is very hot and dry and there are lots of animals such as lions, giraffes, leopards, wild pigs, hyenas, hippos, rhinos, wild dogs, cheetahs and elephants. You can see lots of these animals if you go on a jeep safari.

In Kenya there is a tribe of people known as Masai Mara Warriors who wear bright orange clothing and are very tall. They also carry spears but are very friendly.
