

During the Autumn term Year 3 will be studying portal stories, wishing tales, poetry and non-fiction texts.

• The skills we will be teaching are; fronted adverbials, a range of punctuation including apostrophes and inverted commas whilst encouraging children to write in greater detail, using editing and drafting techniques to improve their work.

Spellings



Your child will be taught spellings appropriate to their ability.

Spellings will be sent home termly and <u>tested every Friday</u>. If you loose your spelling sheet there will be copies on our year group web page.

Please help your child to practice these weekly at home.

<u>Reading at Home</u>




Children will have the opportunity to change their reading books when they are complete. An adult will complete a guided reading session with your child each week so please ensure your child brings their book into school.

Your child must bring in their book at least once a week.

Please make sure you sign the reading record when you have heard your child read at home.

Children will be encouraged to read at their own level & pace.

Please don't feel that your child has to read a whole book in one night. Little and often has proven to be effective.



During the Autumn term we will be spending an extended amount of time looking at number and place value. We will also be calculating larger numbers using a range of practical and written methods.

The skills we will be teaching are; ordering, comparing and rounding up to 4-digit numbers to develop your child's understanding of place value. Through this we hope to develop your child's mastery of number.

Basic Skills



- Your child will have a Basic Skills lesson each day of approximately 45 mins.
- Within this lesson we will be covering handwriting, reciprocal reading, times tables and basic grammar skills.

Our Creative Curriculum



- Theme work each term the children's work will be based on a theme.
- During the Autumn term the theme will be Stone Age.
- The subjects which will be covered in the Creative Curriculum are History, Geography, Art, DT, Computing and Music.
- Alongside the theme your child will also be taught to play a tuned instrument, in year 3 this will be the glockenspiel.





- Weekly spelling tests
- High quality daily marking
- Pre and Post assessments will be completed in maths
- PUMA and PIRA tests will be completed for maths and reading each term. These will provide us with a maths and reading age for your child.
