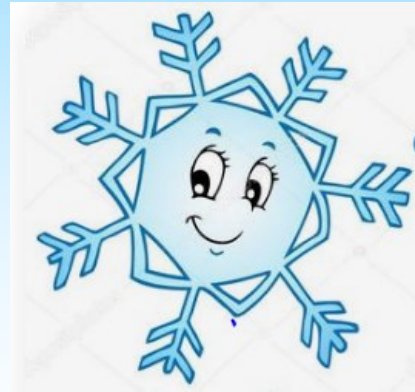


Ruby, Max and Blake making snow angels. Wonderful shapes, well done!

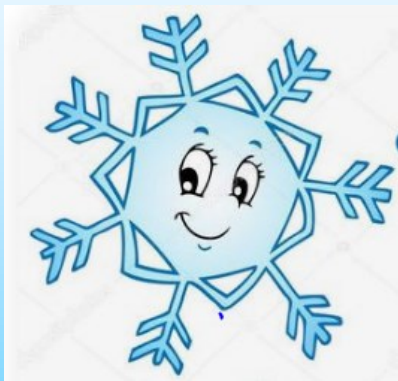
Ariana and Molly working together to draw a snowman in the snow. They added a carrot for the nose and gathered sticks for the arms. Great team work girls!

Risk Taking

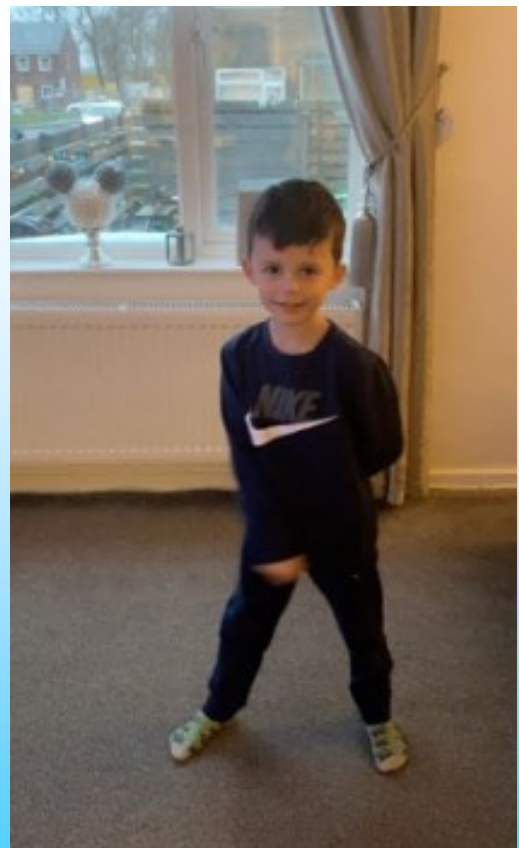


Jakob showing he's prepared to take a risk and go for a ride on his scooter at the coast on a cold, windy day.

Readiness

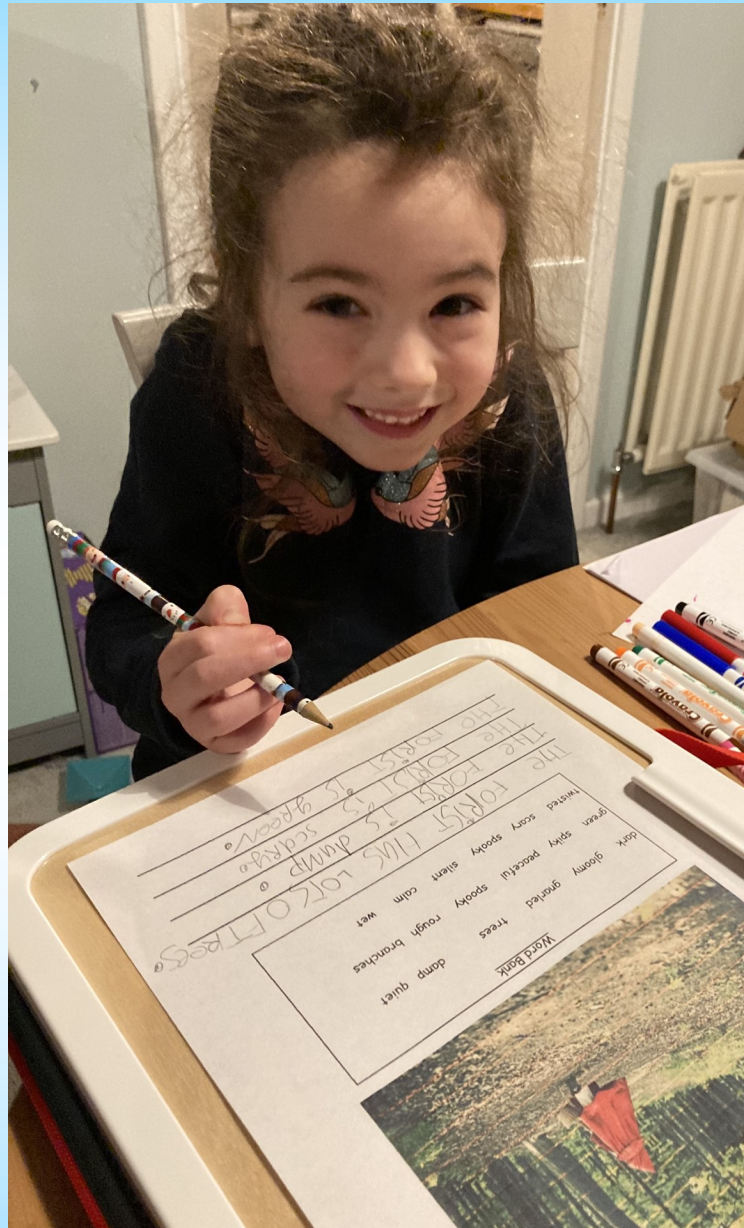


Charlie showing his readiness to look after his guinea pig. He said this makes him feel happy!
